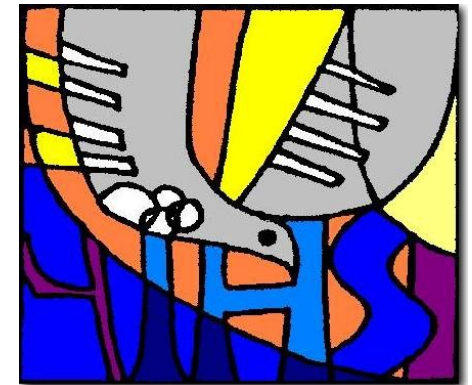
Blessing of water

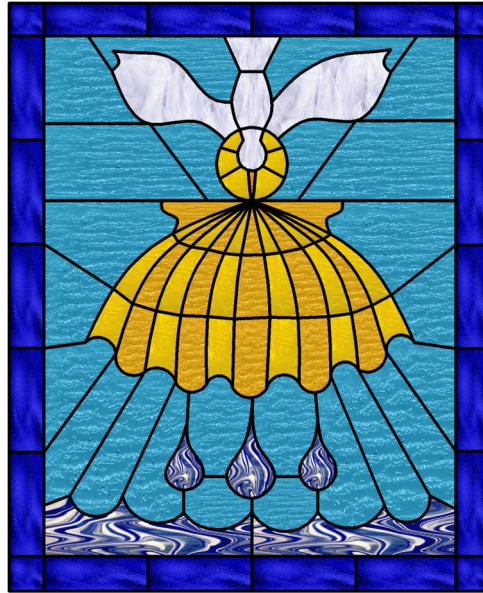
