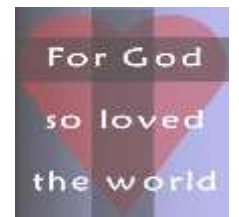

From trials too great to endure, spare us. From the grip of all that is evil, free us.

For you reign in the glory of the power that is love, now and forever.

May it be so. Amen. *(From the New Zealand Prayer Book)*

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

Thanks and praise be to you, almighty God. You justify us through faith and give us peace in our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him you brought us by faith into this experience of grace in which we live, where we rejoice in the hope of sharing your glory. Through faith we are free to rejoice in our sufferings and work to overcome them, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope will not disappoint us, because you have poured out your love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. You show us how much you love us in that while we were still helpless, Christ lived and died for us. Through faith in Him we are saved by grace. And through faith we have the courage to stand together with the oppressed of the world and all people of good will and worship you with angels and archangels, singing:

We thank you, loving Father, because, when we turned away, you sent Jesus, your Son. He gave his life for us on the cross and shows us the way to live. Send your Holy Spirit that these gifts of bread and wine may be for us Christ's body and his blood.

On the night before he died, when darkness had fallen, Jesus took bread. He gave thanks, broke it, and shared it with his disciples, saying: 'This is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me.' After they had eaten, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and shared it with his disciples, saying: 'This is my blood, poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins.'

So Father, with this bread and this cup we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life. As you feed us with these gifts, send your Holy Spirit, and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour. Help us, Father, to love one another, as we look forward to that day when suffering is ended, and all creation is gathered in your loving arms. And now with Mary, Anne and all your saints we give you glory, through Jesus Christ, in the strength of the Spirit, today and

for ever.
