- 6 I have been wicked even from my birth, a sinner when my mother conceived me.
- 7 Behold, you desire truth deep within me and shall make me understand wisdom
in the depths of my heart.
- 8 Purge me with hyssop and I shall be clean;
wash me and I shall be whiter than snow.
- 9 Make me hear of joy and gladness, that the bones you have broken may rejoice.
- 10 Turn your face from my sins and blot out all my misdeeds.
- 11 Make me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.
- 12 Cast me not away from your presence and take not your holy spirit from me.
- 13 Give me again the joy of your salvation and sustain me with your gracious spirit;

New Testament Reading

Hebrews 5.5-10

⁵Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

**'You are my Son,
today I have begotten you';**

⁶as he says also in another place,

**'You are a priest for ever,
according to the order of Melchizedek.'**

⁷In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. ⁸Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; ⁹and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, ¹⁰having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Gospel

John 12.20-33

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

²⁰Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. ²¹They **came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.'** ²²Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³**Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.'** ²⁴Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

²⁷**'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say – "Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour.'** ²⁸Father, glorify your name.' **Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'**

²⁹**The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.'** ³⁰Jesus answered, **'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine.'** ³¹Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. ³²And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to **myself.'** ³³He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.
