Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?'** ¹²**The man said, 'The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate.'** ¹³**Then the LORD God said to the woman, 'What is this that you have done?'** **The woman said, 'The serpent tricked me, and I ate.'** ¹⁴**The LORD God said to the serpent, 'Because you have done this, cursed are you among all animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. ¹⁵I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel.'**

New Testament Reading

2 Corinthians 4.13-5.1

¹³Just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture – **'I believed, and so I spoke'** – we also believe, and so we speak, ¹⁴because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. ¹⁵Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

¹⁶So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner

nature is being renewed day by day. ¹⁷For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, ¹⁸because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.

¹For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

Gospel

Mark 3.20-35

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

²⁰ Then Jesus entered a house, and again a crowd gathered, so that he and his disciples were not even able to eat. ²¹ When his family heard about this, they went **to take charge of him, for they said, "He is out of his mind."**

²² And the teachers of the law who came down from Jerusalem **said, "He is possessed by Beelzebub! By the prince of demons he is driving out demons."**

²³ So Jesus called them over to him and began to speak to them in parables: **"How can Satan drive out Satan? ²⁴ If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ²⁵ If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand. ²⁶ And if Satan opposes himself and is divided, he cannot stand; his end has come. ²⁷ In fact, no one can enter a strong man's house without first tying him up. Then he can plunder the strong man's house. ²⁸ Truly I tell you, people can be forgiven all their sins and every slander they utter, ²⁹ but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven; they are guilty of an eternal sin."**

³⁰ **He said this because they were saying, "He has an impure spirit."**

³¹ **Then Jesus' mother and brothers arrived.** Standing outside, they sent someone in to call him. ³² **A crowd was sitting around him, and they told him, "Your mother and brothers are outside looking for you."**

³³ **"Who are my mother and my brothers?"** he asked.

³⁴ Then he looked at those seated in a circle around him and said, **"Here are my mother and my brothers! ³⁵ Whoever does God's will is my brother and sister and mother."**
