1 Kings 8.22-23,41-43

²²Solomon stood before the altar of the LORD in the presence of all the assembly of Israel, and spread out his hands to heaven. ²³**He said, ‘O LORD, God of Israel,** there is no God like you in heaven above or on earth beneath, keeping covenant and steadfast love for your servants who walk before you with all their heart.

⁴¹When a foreigner, who is not of your people Israel, comes from a distant land because of your name – ⁴²for they shall hear of your great name, your mighty hand, and your outstretched arm – when a foreigner comes and prays towards this house, ⁴³then hear in heaven your dwelling-place, and do according to all that the foreigner calls to you, so that all the peoples of the earth may know your name and fear you, as do your people Israel, and so that they may know that your name has **been invoked on this house that I have built.**

New Testament Reading

Galatians 1.1-12

¹Paul an apostle – sent neither by human commission nor from human authorities, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead – ²and **all the members of God’s family who are with me, To the churches of Galatia:**

³Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, ⁴who gave himself for our sins to set us free from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, ⁵to whom be the glory for ever and ever. Amen.

⁶I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting the one who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel – ⁷not that there is another

gospel, but there are some who are confusing you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ. ⁸But even if we or an angel from heaven should proclaim to you a gospel contrary to what we proclaimed to you, let that one be accursed! ⁹As we have said before, so now I repeat, if anyone proclaims to you a gospel contrary to what you received, let that one be accursed!

¹⁰**Am I now seeking human approval, or God’s approval? Or am I trying to please people?** If I were still pleasing people, I would not be a servant of Christ.

¹¹For I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of human origin; ¹²for I did not receive it from a human source, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ.

Gospel

Luke 7.1-10

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

¹Jesus entered the town of Capernaum. ²A centurion there had a slave whom he valued highly, and who was ill and close to death. ³When he heard about Jesus, he sent some Jewish elders to him, asking him to come and heal his slave. ⁴When they **came to Jesus, they appealed to him earnestly, saying, ‘He is worthy of having you do this for him,** ⁵for he loves our people, and it is he who built our synagogue for us.’ ⁶And Jesus went with them, but when he was not far from the house, the **centurion sent friends to say to him, ‘Lord, do not trouble yourself, for I am not worthy to have you come under my roof;** ⁷therefore I did not presume to come to you. But only speak the word, and let my servant be healed. ⁸For I also am a man **set under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to one, “Go,” and he goes, and to another, “Come,” and he comes, and to my slave, “Do this,” and the slave does it.’** ⁹When Jesus heard this he was amazed at him, and turning to the crowd **that followed him, he said, ‘I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith.’**

¹⁰When those who had been sent returned to the house, they found the slave in good health.
