Marriage should be honoured by all, and the marriage bed kept pure, for

God has said,

“The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid.
What can man do to me?”

Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the

Gospel

Luke 14.1,7-14

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

¹On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the
Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely.

²When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honour, he told them
a parable. ³“When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not
sit down at the place of honour, in case someone more distinguished than
you has been invited by your host; ⁴and the host who invited both of you
may come and say to you, “Give this person your place,” and then in
disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. ⁵But when you are
invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes,
he may say to you, “Friend, move up higher”; then you will be honoured in
the presence of all who sit at the table with you. ⁶For all who exalt
themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be
exalted.’

⁷**He said also to the one who had invited him, “When you give a luncheon or**
a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or
rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be
repaid. ⁸But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame,
and the blind. ⁹And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for
you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.’

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
