2 Timothy 2.8-15

⁸Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David – that is my gospel, ⁹for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. ¹⁰Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. ¹¹The saying is sure:
If we have died with him, we will also live with him;
¹²if we endure, we will also reign with him;
if we deny him, he will also deny us;
¹³if we are faithless, he remains faithful –
for he cannot deny himself.
¹⁴Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. ¹⁵Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

Gospel

Luke 17.11-19

When the Gospel is announced the reader says
Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.
All Glory to you, O Lord.
¹¹On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. ¹²As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance,
¹³they called out, saying, 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!' ¹⁴When he saw them, he **said to them, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.'** **And as they went, they were made clean.** ¹⁵Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. ¹⁶**He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him.** And he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷**Then Jesus asked, 'Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they?'** ¹⁸Was none of them found to return and give praise **to God except this foreigner?'** ¹⁹**Then he said to the Samaritan, 'Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well.'**
