## Old Testament Reading

*Isaiah 40.1-11*

<sup>1</sup>Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God.

<sup>2</sup>Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her  
that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid,  
**that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.**

<sup>3</sup>A voice cries out:

**'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD,**  
make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

<sup>4</sup>Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low;  
the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

<sup>5</sup>Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed,  
and all people shall see it together,  
**for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.'**

<sup>6</sup>**A voice says, 'Cry out!'**

**And I said, 'What shall I cry?'**

All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field.

<sup>7</sup>The grass withers, the flower fades,  
when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass.

<sup>8</sup>The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand for ever.

<sup>9</sup>Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings;  
lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings,  
**lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, 'Here is your God!'**

<sup>10</sup>See, the Lord GOD comes with might, and his arm rules for him;  
his reward is with him, and his recompense before him.

<sup>11</sup>He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms,  
and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

This is the word of the Lord.

## New Testament Reading

*2 Peter 3.8-15a*

<sup>8</sup>Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years,  
and a thousand years are like one day. <sup>9</sup>The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some  
think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to  
repentance. <sup>10</sup>But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass  
away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and  
everything that is done on it will be disclosed.

<sup>11</sup>Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be  
in leading lives of holiness and godliness, <sup>12</sup>waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of  
God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will  
melt with fire? <sup>13</sup>But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new  
earth, where righteousness is at home. <sup>14</sup>Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these  
things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; <sup>15</sup>and regard the  
patience of our Lord as salvation.

## Gospel

*Mark 1.1-8*

*When the Gospel is announced the reader says*

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>1</sup>The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

<sup>2</sup>As it is written in the prophet Isaiah,

**'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you,**  
who will prepare your way;

<sup>3</sup>the voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

**"Prepare the way of the Lord,  
make his paths straight",**

<sup>4</sup>John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the  
forgiveness of sins. <sup>5</sup>And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of  
Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing  
their sins. <sup>6</sup>**Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and**  
he ate locusts and wild honey. <sup>7</sup>**He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is**  
coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. <sup>8</sup>I have  
**baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.'**

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
