

Ephesians 5.15-20

drunk with wine, for that is debauchery; but be filled with the Spirit, ¹⁹as you
sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and

making melody to the Lord in your hearts, ²⁰giving thanks to God the Father
at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel

John 6.51-58

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to the Jews: ⁵¹**‘I am the living bread that came down from heaven.**
Whoever eats of this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I will give
for the life of the world is my flesh.’

⁵²**The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, ‘How can this man give**
us his flesh to eat?’ ⁵³**So Jesus said to them, ‘Very truly, I tell you, unless you**
eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.

⁵⁴Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will
raise them up on the last day; ⁵⁵for my flesh is true food and my blood is true
drink. ⁵⁶Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in
them. ⁵⁷Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so
whoever eats me will live because of me. ⁵⁸This is the bread that came down
from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the
one who eats this bread will live for ever.’
