

### New Testament Reading

*Revelation 21.1-6*

<sup>1</sup>I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth  
had passed away, and the sea was no more. <sup>2</sup>And I saw the holy city, the new  
Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for  
her husband. <sup>3</sup>And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying,  
**‘See, the home of God is among mortals.**  
He will dwell with them;

they will be his peoples,  
and God himself will be with them;  
<sup>4</sup>he will wipe every tear from their eyes.  
Death will be no more;  
mourning and crying and pain will be no more,  
**for the first things have passed away.’**

<sup>5</sup>**And the one who was seated on the throne said, ‘See, I am making all things new.’**  
**Also he said, ‘Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.’** <sup>6</sup>Then he said

### Gospel

*John 11.32-44*

*When the Gospel is announced the reader says*

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>32</sup>When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to  
**him, ‘Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.’** <sup>33</sup>When Jesus  
saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly  
disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. <sup>34</sup>**He said, ‘Where have you laid him?’ They**  
**said to him, ‘Lord, come and see.’** <sup>35</sup>Jesus began to weep. <sup>36</sup>**So the Jews said, ‘See**  
**how he loved him!’** <sup>37</sup>**But some of them said, ‘Could not he who opened the eyes of**  
**the blind man have kept this man from dying?’**

<sup>38</sup>Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone  
was lying against it. <sup>39</sup>**Jesus said, ‘Take away the stone.’ Martha, the sister of the**  
**dead man, said to him, ‘Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead**  
**four days.’** <sup>40</sup>**Jesus said to her, ‘Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see**  
**the glory of God?’** <sup>41</sup>So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upward and  
said, **‘Father, I thank you for having heard me.** <sup>42</sup>I knew that you always hear me, but  
I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe  
**that you sent me.’** <sup>43</sup>**When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, ‘Lazarus,**  
**come out!’** <sup>44</sup>The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth,  
**and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, ‘Unbind him, and let him go.’**

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
