19 You have made the moon to mark the seasons; the sun knows its time for setting.
20 You make darkness, and it is night, when all the animals of the forest come
creeping out.
21 The young lions roar for their prey, seeking their food from God.
22 When the sun rises, they withdraw and lie down in their dens.
23 People go out to their work and to their labour until the evening.
24 O LORD, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all;
the earth is full of your creatures.
25 Yonder is the sea, great and wide, creeping things innumerable are there,
living things both small and great.

New Testament Reading

Colossians 1.15-25

¹⁵Christ is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; ¹⁶for in him all things
in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or
dominions or rulers or powers – all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷He
himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸He is the head of the body,
the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have
first place in everything. ¹⁹For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰and

through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in
heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

²¹ And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, ²² he has now
reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and
irreproachable before him— ²³ provided that you continue securely established and
steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard,
which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this
gospel.

²⁴ I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is
lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. ²⁵ I became its
servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of
God fully known,

Gospel

Mark 1.16-31

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

¹⁶ As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a
net into the sea—for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ **And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will
make you fish for people."** ¹⁸ And immediately they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹ As he
went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their
boat mending the nets. ²⁰ Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in
the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

²¹ They went to Capernaum; and when the sabbath came, he entered the synagogue and
taught. ²² They were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority,
and not as the scribes. ²³ Just then there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit,
²⁴ **and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to
destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God."** ²⁵ But Jesus rebuked him, saying,
"Be silent, and come out of him!" ²⁶ And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying with a
loud voice, came out of him. ²⁷ They were all amazed, and they kept on asking one another,
**"What is this? A new teaching—with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and
they obey him."** ²⁸ At once his fame began to spread throughout the surrounding region of
Galilee. ²⁹ As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew,
with James and John. ³⁰ Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told
him about her at once. ³¹ He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the
fever left her, and she began to serve them.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
