Step 4 Changes at St Anne's

Now that we have reached Step 4 of the Government Plan we have started to make changes towards returning to a more normal worship style.

Please let Mick or the Churchwardens have any comments or concerns you have.

Church layout

We have returned the church seating to its normal layout and the one way system is no longer needed. We would however encourage people to continue to maintain sensible gapping when taking seats.

We recognise that sitting in close proximity will be a concern to some people.

However providing that people are not sitting in adjacent seats we will more than maintain 1m distancing. We will have "Please leave this seat unoccupied" signs at the entrance to the church and you are welcome to take a pair when arriving to place either side of you so that others are aware of your preference without your having to tell them.

For those who still feel it advisable to continue full 2m social distancing we have left 3 rows in the SW (in front of the font). Please do not use these unless you need to.

Face Coverings

Wearing of face coverings is now optional. However Mick, the churchwardens and the welcomers will continue to wear face coverings so that people who wish to continue to retain mask usage are not brought into direct contact with people who are not doing so.

At present we would however suggest as a matter of courtesy that face coverings continue to be worn when entering and leaving the church and singing hymns.

Singing

We will recommence singing hymns and responses

Attendance Lists

We will cease keeping attendance records for services but will continue to provide the QR code at the church door.

Continued precautions

For the present we will continue with some of the changes we have at present:

- ◇ We will continue to provide hand sanitiser
- ◇ Mick will continue the consecration and distribution of the Eucharist as at present and will wear a face covering at these points as at present
- ◇ We will continue to share the peace as at present
- ◇ We will continue to keep the doors and windows open to provide increased ventilation
- ◇ We will not restart serving coffee in the centre but will continue bringing our own refreshments to the church garden, weather permitting
