³³Pilate asked Jesus, 'Are you the King of the Jews?' ³⁴Jesus answered, 'Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?' ³⁵Pilate replied, 'I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?' ³⁶Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here.' ³⁷Pilate asked him, 'So you are a king?' Jesus answered, 'You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.'

Giacomo Puccini died nearly a hundred years ago, on 29/11/ 1924. Born in Lucca, a city in Tuscany between Pisa and Florence, he was destined to become a musician. For 124 years, four generations before him had been the organist and choirmaster in the cathedral but, when his father died when Puccini was only six, his uncle took on the post –temporarily until Giacomo finished his studies. Aged 35 he had an international hit - with "La bohème". This was followed by "Tosca", "Madama Butterfly" and "Turandot" amongst others. He died, aged 65, in Brussels



The music before the service is a "Fugue in F" composed in his second year at the Milan Conservatoire; "Gloria" from the Messa di Gloria; "Musetta's *Waltz"* from La boheme; "*One fine day*" from Butterfly. "*Crucifixus*" from the Messa during the Peace; "*Humming Chorus*" from Butterfly during the Eucharist and "*Nessum Dorma*" from Turandot as the closing voluntary. We do not take a collection during the service at St. Anne's as we have a Parish Giving scheme.
