Old Testament Reading

Genesis 2.4b-9,15-25

⁴In the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens, ⁵when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up for the LORD God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground; ⁶but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground ⁷then the LORD God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being. ⁸And the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed. ⁹Out of the ground the LORD God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

¹⁵The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. ¹⁶And the LORD God commanded the man, 'You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; ¹⁷but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.'

¹⁸The LORD God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner.' ¹⁹So out of the ground the LORD God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. ²⁰The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. ²¹So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. ²²And the rib that the LORD God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. ²³Then the man said,

'This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken.'

²⁴Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh. ²⁵And the man and his wife were both naked, and were not ashamed. This is the word of the Lord.

¹I looked, and there in heaven a door stood open! And the first voice, which I had heard speaking to me like a trumpet, said, 'Come up here, and I will show you what must take place after this.' ²At once I was in the spirit, and there in heaven stood a throne, with one seated on the throne! ³And the one seated there looks like jasper and cornelian, and around the throne is a rainbow that looks like an emerald. ⁴Around the throne are twenty-four thrones, and seated on the thrones are twenty-four elders, dressed in white robes, with golden crowns on their heads. ⁵Coming from the throne are flashes of lightning, and rumblings and peals of thunder, and in front of the throne burn seven flaming torches, which are the seven spirits of God; ⁶and in front of the throne there is something like a sea of glass, like crystal. Around the throne, and on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, full of eyes in front and behind: ⁷the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with a face like a human face, and the fourth living creature like a flying eagle. ⁸And the four living creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and inside. Day and night without ceasing they sing,

'Holy, holy, holy,

the Lord God the Almighty,

who was and is and is to come.'

⁹And whenever the living creatures give glory and honour and thanks to the one who is seated on the throne, who lives for ever and ever, ¹⁰the twenty-four elders fall before the one who is seated on the throne and worship the one who lives for ever and ever; they cast their crowns before the throne, singing,

¹¹'You are worthy, our Lord and God,

to receive glory and honour and power,

for you created all things,

Thanks be to God.

and by your will they existed and were created.'

This is the word of the Lord.

Gospel *Luke 4.14-21*

When the Gospel is announced the reader says
Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

²²One day Jesus got into a boat with his disciples, and he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side of the lake.' So they put out, ²³and while they were sailing he fell asleep. A gale swept down on the lake, and the boat was filling with water, and they were in danger. ²⁴They went to him and woke him up, shouting, 'Master, Master, we are perishing!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and the raging waves; they ceased, and there was a calm. ²⁵He said to them, 'Where is your faith?' They were afraid and amazed, and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that he commands even the winds and the water, and they obey him?'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Lent Course - We will again be holding a Zoom Lent course this year on Wednesday at 8pm from 12th March to 9th April. It is entitled True Frreedom and will look at modern slavery using the text of Galatians.

Today's Music. The opening music by Gaspard Corrette and his son Michael. It comes from an organ mass published in 1703, "for the use of religious ladies". The son revised and added to the collection of 25 short pieces. The pieces are "Basse de Cromhorne"; "Recit tendre pour le Nazard"; "Dialogue a deux Choeurs -1"; "Fugue"; "Dialogue a deux Choeurs - 2"; "Dialogue de Voix humaine"; "Concert pour les Flutes"; "Grand Plein Jeu". For the procession to the pulpit - "Trio de Graduel". Music at the Peace will be the Ukrainian "River Song" and "Prayer for Ukraine". During the communion, "Pastoral Prelude" and "Verset in Gregorian mode" by Jean Langlais - blind since the age of 2 and organist of Sainte Clotilde in Paris. They are played from music signed by him, for Bill, at a recital he gave in the Royal Albert Hall in 1967. The outgoing voluntary is "Sortie on Quid nunc in tenebris tristis aberras" by Alexandre Guilmant, - widely regarded as the leading French organist of the late 1800's.
