Blessing of the Fire

Almighty God, who through your Son, Jesus Christ, has revealed to all your people the fire of your brightness: Bless this new fire; Father + Son + and Holy Spirit + and grant that this Easter feast we may be drawn near to your Son, Jesus Christ, The true light of the world. **Amen.**

Blessing of the Easter Candle

Eternal God,
who made this most holy night
to shine with the brightness of your one true light:
set us aflame with the fire of your love,
and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

the beginning and the end,
Alpha and Omega,
all time belongs to him,

The Easter Candle is lit from the fire

May the light of Christ, rising in glory,
banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.



All process into the Church followed by the reader carrying the Scriptures and the celebrant carrying the Easter Candle. The people collect a candle and return to their seats. As the Easter candle is brought towards the altar the procession will stop three times and the people will light their candles from the Easter Candle. At each stop there will be a reading:

During the procession at each stop sing (following cantor)

The light of Christ

Thanks be to God

At the back of the Church Exodus 14: 10—31

Half way down the church Ezekiel 37: 1-14

At the front the Church Romans 6: 3-11

Easter Acclamation

Alleluia Christ is Risen

He is risen indeed Alleluia

The lights are put on and the church bell is rung then all sing.

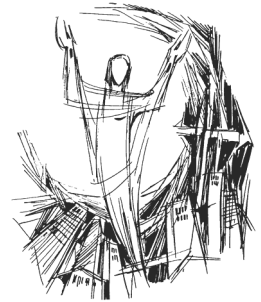
Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Proclamation of the Easter Gospel

Brothers and sisters in Christ let us ask the Lord our God to bless this water He has created which we shall use to recall our baptism. May He renew us and keep us faithful to the Spirit we have all received.

The Celebrant lowers the Easter Candle into the water

We ask you, Father, with your Son to send the Holy Spirit upon these waters. May all who are buried with Christ in the death of Baptism rise also with him to newness of life. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

The candle is placed in its stand.

Renewal of Baptismal promises

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, we remember that through the paschal mystery we have died and been buried with him in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life within the family of his Church. Now that we have completed our observance of Lent, we renew the promises made at our baptism, affirming our allegiance to Christ, and our rejection of all that is evil. Therefore I ask these questions:

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil?

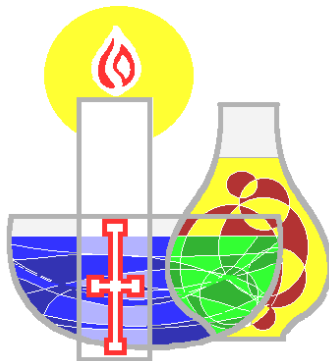
I renounce evil.

And now I ask you to make the profession of Christian faith into which you were baptized, and in which you live and grow. Do you believe and trust in God the Father, who made the world?

I believe and trust in him

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ who redeemed mankind?

I believe and trust in him.



Do you believe and trust in his Holy Spirit,
who gives life to the people of God?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.

**We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.**

The people are then sprinkled with the newly blessed water:

We praise and bless you, loving Father,

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends
and, taking bread, he praised you.

Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did,
in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice
made once for all upon the cross.
Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation,
we proclaim his death and resurrection
until he comes in glory.
